HFMD is a common viral illness that usually affects in-10-years of age or younger. mouth disease.

Symptoms of HFMD include cold-like conditions, fever, mouth sores, loss of appetite, cough, and a skin rash; a non-itchy red rash that de-

velops on the hands and feet, and sometimes the rash can develop into painful blisters; painful mouth ulcers.

Persons with symptoms should consult their family physician and take necessary measures in order to mitigate an increase in the observed numbers of HFMD.
