St. Kitts and Nevis Coast Guard at Charles A. Woodley Pier. The men, whose identities were not disclosed, were rescued Monday around 1:00am off the northern side of the island near the coast of White Wall. The men were dehydrated and very tired and were both taken to Queen Beatrix Medical Centre for observation.



Committee formed to look into new salary structure

Executive Council and Saba United People Labour Union Association (SUPLUA) have agreed to form a technical committee to look into the consequences of the salary structure that was introduced in October 2014.

The new salary structure went into effect after negotiations with the unions and Government Service Carib-Netherlands RCN, which also negotiates on behalf of the local government, were concluded last year.

The new salary structure is similar to the one that was adopted for all RCN employees. The basic salaries in this scheme are lower than those in the previous structure. However, there were two additional allowances included so that the net salaries would not be affected.

Shortly after the introduction of the new salary structure civil servants employed by the Public Entity Saba expressed their concern to the Executive Council about how it would affect their spending power both in the long and short term.

After the pay structure went into effect the civil servants formally requested SUPLUA to represent them "in all matters related to their positions as civil servants working for the government of Saba."

In the meeting the Executive Council recognized SUPLUA as union to represent the civil servants of the Public Entity.

During the meeting the Executive Council made a proposal to SUPLUA to form a technical committee which will be comprised of two representatives on behalf of SUPLUA and two representatives on behalf
